We are regular participants in the Habitat for Humanity collegiate challenge and mobilize large teams of students to help build housing for those in need across the US.

EWB-UC students run every part of our projects, from surveying and vetting partners, creating high-quality technical designs and documentation, and then traveling thousands of miles to implement their visions. The process allows us to apply our education to real projects, and impact real people. Along the way, we learn to balance leadership, scholarship, and service, practice creative problem-solving, and become better cross-cultural communicators.

## **International Projects**



## **Organization History**

EWB-UC was founded by four engineering students who wanted to respond to the global water crisis. While they couldn't change the world all at once, they knew that partnering with one community at a time could lead to a massive impact. Over the next few years, the team devoted all of their time outside of classes to designing and constructing a clean water system serving a community of 500 people.

From those humble beginnings, our chapter has continued to grow and take on more ambitious projects such as constructing latrines, schoolhouses, and hand-washing stations. Today, our projects provide the main water supply for our partner communities.

## **Project History**

In total, EWB-UC has 3 active projects, 2 in Tanzania and 1 in Rwanda. These project committees, Nyambogo, Burere, and Gikingo, are creating designs and implementation plans to expand water systems to nearby communities. Their efforts will provide more residents with access to clean water and decrease water collection times for individuals in these communities.

The Burere system's final implementation is projected to be completed during the Spring of 2024. The Nyambogo expansions will continue for the next three years in phases. These projects will require a \$10,000 investment from the EWB-UC chapter in materials alone.

## **Partners and Projects**

Domestic outreach and local volunteer work are important aspects of our organization, facilitated by our Community Outreach Committee. Our longest-standing domestic partnership is with Habitat for Humanity, a non-profit that helps families build and improve their housing. Each year we participate in two trips where our students travel to build sites where there are not enough local volunteers. Our chapter is also involved in longer-term local partnerships with Western Wildlife Corridor and Happen Inc., a Cincinnati-based non-profit.

Additionally, over the past year, we've volunteered at events such as the Queen Bee Marathon, Women's Basketball Education Day, Women in Engineering Connect, and Keep Cincinnati Beautiful.

### Local Impact

Our latest local project includes designing and constructing a fully wheelchair-accessible community garden with Happen Inc. in the Northside neighborhood.


At Western Wildlife Corridor we are helping construct an 80 ft. walking bridge for visitors to explore the WWC Nature Preserve.


In Fall 2023, we facilitated over 1500 volunteer hours by 60 active student members of our chapter.


